The Electric Prunes have developed a new sound, which is the basis of success in the "Rock" music of today.

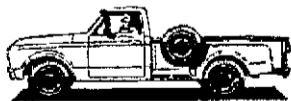
These young artists all are fine musicians and their youthful showmanship has been one of the factors of their success on TV and personal appearances. They sing play their new beat music and are the up-beat of success.

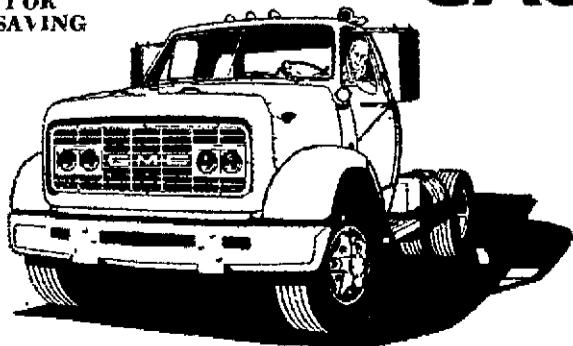

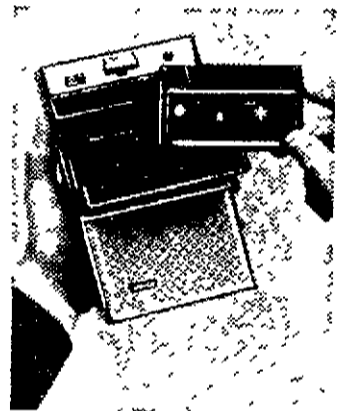
